At least one section of trail in every town to be completed within a year

Shoreline Greenway Trail has been very active since last summer, making major progress in developing the trail and providing access to it. We've continued to work with our four towns, land trusts and other interests to design and develop beautiful, ecologically sensitive trail sections and boardwalks, and we expect to have at least one section complete in every town by next year. Nearly half of the trail is completed, under construction, or established, and we're excited about the challenge of connecting the sections into a safe, magnificent trail connecting the Shoreline's main urban hub with one of the state's most spectacular beach parks.

Our First Saturday programs over the past year offered not only peaceful walks through beautiful land but also exposure to art-making and a lesson in tree planting. Our town teams have been busy promoting the trail and gaining community as well as financial support for its completion with parades, house tours, bike safety rodeos, public presentations and other activities. We've continued to encourage children to get outside and enjoy our green space by taking school groups on nature hikes. The Many Ways to Support the Trail

In the years since we incorporated in 2003, we have raised more than \$1.3 million from members and other trail supporters like you. 87 percent of that money has gone directly to construction of the trail and activities promoting its use and only 13% for fundraising and administration. In addition, we have received \$3.3 million from Federal and State grants, a major boost for our trail-building.

Much of our support has come through donations made via our website or in response to our fundraising mailers, but there are many other ways you can support Shoreline Greenway Trail. They include taking advantage of an employer's matching-gifts program, making Shoreline Greenway Trail a beneficiary of a bequest or planned gift, signing up for monthly giving via credit card or PayPal, or donating appreciated stock. Several supporters have dedicated benches along the trail to loved ones.

Our Town Teams at Work

Madison – Starting work on the final leg

It was a busy and productive year for the Madison SGT team. In the spring, we opened the new parking lot at the eastern trailhead adjacent to the main entrance to Hammonasset Beach State Park, and it's proved to be a tremendously popular facility. It has 61 parking spaces (including three ADA and three RV spots) and, thanks to Eagle Scout Tom O'Sullivan, a seating area and a bicycle rack. The parking lot provides easy and free access to the Hammonasset section of the trail, whose high usage has been encouraging—as have the enthusiastic comments we've heard from many who have walked or ridden it.

We continued to expand the trail itself, constructing trail and a retaining wall between the parking-lot walkway and the Hammonasset toll booths, and we began work on the final leg that will connect the park with Madison town roads at Liberty Street. We're now designing that trail section, a retaining wall and a water crossing in advance of applying for an encroachment permit from the state Department of Transportation; we're also clarifying other permits and raising funds to complete the job.

Our well-attended First Saturday walk in September featured 15 en plein air painters from the Madison Art Society, who later exhibited their works at the Scranton Library. Many of the works created that day are for sale, with a portion of the sales from the proceeds benefiting the trail. Contact the society at madisonartsociety. blogspot.com if you're interested. Additionally, we hosted a tree-planting workshop led by landscape architect Barbara Yeager. It was instructive for professionals and amateurs alike while yielding two trees, the first plantings for our rain garden, which is a focal point of the trailhead landscaping. Finally, geocaching has become a popular activity along the Hammonasset trail. Keep your eyes open: you might find someone's cache—but for sure, you'll discover exciting things happening all along the trail!

Guilford – First section to be complete next year

Our newly revitalized Guilford team is organizing new outreach events and progressing with plans for the first section of trail in town, an almost one-mile section completely off road along the south side of Route One, from East River bridge to Boston Street. We are grateful to Guilford Town Engineer Jim Portley and his department, who designed the section and are shepherding the design approval process with the State through each stage. At a public meeting in August, we received overwhelming support from all 75 Guilford citizens attending, including homeowners along the proposed route.

Our Team made a big splash at the Guilford Fair Parade in September, with twenty-one SGT members marching and riding bikes behind our banner, trailed by our "caboose" - a young family's new Jeep decorated with Shoreline Greenway Trail signs, posters, and their four children riding on top! One of our SGT walkers, wearing a "Nature on the Trail" sign with a huge spider on her shirt, her hat covered with leaves, was interviewed on Channel 8 news that night.

We held our first Guilford fundraiser on Halloween weekend, courtesy of a homeowner who designated Shoreline Greenway Trail as one of two beneficiaries of the Homes of Distinction Zero-Energy House Tour. Eleven volunteers served as hosts and parked cars by Breakfast Woodworks. Attended by more than 500 people, the event gave us great exposure and raised almost \$3,000 for the trail.

Dennis Dostert of Guilford Community Television interviewed the Guilford Team co-chairs for a future airing. In December Pam Simonds and Chip Angle spoke at a Guilford Rotary Club luncheon attended by c. 100 members; we provided our bike safety bookmarks for their stocking stuffers. Later they invited us to apply for a grant.

An informal Volunteer Open House at the community Center on a December afternoon brought us several new volunteers, including Kristen d'Souza who jumped in to organize our first Kids Bike Safety Rodeo, finding six volunteers to help! They have partnered with Guilford Park and Rec Department, Guilford Police and Zane's Cycles to put on this fun event on Saturday, May 2, from 9am to 11am at Cox Elementary School. Kids 5 to 10 learn how to bike safely, road signs, have helmet fittings, and ride a fun obstacle course. The public was invited to bring any used bikes - kids and adults - to the event to donate to the Bikes for Kids program.

Branford – New trail added; lots of outreach conducted

While the Branford team continued to add new trail in town, some of its greatest accomplishments in 2014 were in outreach. We held our first annual Branford Town Meeting in March, drawing about 30 people and signing up new volunteers. We had many visitors to our table at Zane's Cycles' Big Wheel event in April, and that same month, about 50 children attended a bicycle safety rodeo we co-sponsored with the Branford Recreation Center, Branford Early Childhood Collaborative, the Branford police and fire departments, and Zane's Cycles.

Shoreline Greenway Trail volunteers led groups of schoolchildren on several trail walks throughout the spring, and in June, we collaborated with the East Haven team and the Shoreline Trolley Museum to sponsor our second annual Connecticut Trails Day walk; Leo Cristofar and Peg Stamp led a group of more than 100 walkers. Trails Day was soon followed by the annual Branford Festival, where our booth attracted many visitors. Just after Christmas, about 80 walkers attended our third annual Get the Children Outside Walk on an unusually warm December day.

As for the trailitself, under Jack Wood's supervision, we completed the 8/10-mile-long Tilcon section leading from the Stony Creek Trolley Trail. Guilford Boy Scout Charles Slate earned his Eagle Scout badge by clearing the Outdoor Classroom on the Pine Orchard Birch Road section. We were very pleased in October when the Branford Board Selectmen voted to apply funds from a federal grant to the design and construction of one mile of new trail, from Pine Orchard Road to Meadow Street across Tabor property. The completion of that

section will bring us close to our goal of having a safe, offroad bicycle/pedestrian trail connecting the town center, railroad station and Stony Creek section of town. We also established a monthly trail maintenance schedule to keep the sections we've already built in tip-top shape.

The Birch Road Trail reminds us that a greenway trail is not just a path. It's a way of connecting people with nature in all sorts of wonderful ways, of showing people that nature matters and that they have a role to play in its protection. This section of trail is rich with opportunity, as four different nature experiences lie within a half-mile of one another: the Shoreline Greenway Trail, the Outdoor Classroom, Nature's Garden and the Community Garden. The SGT Branford team is fortunate to have a hand in developing and maintaining these spaces, and we're pleased to see them used frequently for walking, jogging, biking or just plain sitting and staring at nature at one of the two benches designed by member Pete Peterson.

East Haven – Activities underway at Farm River State Park and Bradford Preserve

Trail design, permitting, clearing and construction continued on several fronts in the past year. Our town team partnered with Boy Scout Troop 401 to clear a half-mile trail through Farm River State Park. Clearing the trail helped raise public awareness of this lovely, peaceful and pristine park that is rich with small wildlife, osprey nests, caves and spectacular water views. The East Haven town team recently received permission from Connecticut DEEP to build on the existing trail. We plan to apply for grant funds and seek donations to build the Farm River State Park Trail.

One of Troop 401's scouts, Joseph Capozzo, chose Shoreline Greenway Trail for his Eagle Scout service project and created an interpretive brochure to educate users about the nature findings along the D.C. Moore School section of trail. The brochure, which is available at the trailhead kiosk, has been popular with educators and students who often use the trail on field trips.

As 2015 gets underway, we are working with Mayor Maturo and his administration, the Town Council, engineers and state agencies to apply federal and state grant funds to the design and permit phase for a section of trail in the beautiful Bradford Preserve—thanks to the great support of the East Haven Land Trust, which allowed us to route the trail through their property. Once that phase of the project is complete, we will begin construction of a half-mile, ecologically sensitive boardwalk through the preserve and build a 720-foot cleared trail at Moore School. The finished segment will connect East Haven's beach area and Splash Pad Park to the granite-topped trail at the school, onto the trailhead and to the parking area at Mansfield Grove Road.

We continue to collaborate with the Branford team on a way to cross the Farm River and link our trails, and we are working with Branford and the Shoreline Trolley Museum on the annual Connecticut Trails Day celebration in June. Participants will take a scenic trip aboard a restored trolley and disembark for a walk along the proposed route to the Farm River. On the return trip, a museum volunteer will lead us on a tour of vintage trolleys. Come out and see the great progress we're making!

Youth on the March for **Shoreline Greenway Trail**

If you ask active members of the Shoreline Greenway Trail team why they devote hours of volunteer time to the trail, most will include in their answer something to this effect: "to leave a legacy of access to healthy exercise and nature for our children." It is fitting, then, that our towns' young people increasingly play a role in supporting, maintaining or just being on the trail.

Scouts: Sometimes their connection to the trail comes from their work at school or involvement with another organization such as the Boy Scouts. The many examples include the Scouts in East Haven who helped to build the Farm River Park trail section, the Guilford Scout who cleaned up Branford's Outdoor Classroom and the numerous high school students throughout our towns who have worked on the Shoreline Greenway Trail as part of their schools' community service or capstone requirements.

At other times, kids' participation is serendipitous, such as when three young men from Branford happened to come along when an SGT trail maintenance team was working on the Tabor property. On a lark, the boys pitched in, even going back home to get tools and water to share with the rest of the crew. What a great day!

School Walks: School-led walks are an important part of Shoreline Greenway Trail's outreach. The trail can be a living laboratory for any town's science or environmental education curriculum, and it can be particularly valuable in helping kids understand the role that open space plays in a region's ecology. When elementary-age students walk the trail with their teachers, they tell us they enjoy spotting wildlife such as osprey and they're deeply affected by the trash they sometimes see irresponsibly discarded. They send us the most wonderful, colorful thank-you notes you can imagine! The participation of schools in the trail effort emphasizes the importance of Access for All, as we celebrate the fact that our trails at their best will accommodate people in wheelchairs and with other limitations to mobility.

Family Fun: But perhaps the best participation of all from our children starts with the parents who take them out onto the trail or bring them on our First Saturday walks and bike rides. Whether walking or cycling, parents play an important role, exposing their children to the beauty of the great outdoors, building interest in physical activity, spreading awareness of the Shoreline Greenway Trail and carrying the trail's legacy to future generations. Thank you!



As I write this, spring is approaching, with its promise of new growth. It's fitting that the Shoreline Greenway Trail is growing as well. This has been a year of great achievement in regard to the trail itself and of positive transition in our organization.



Recognizing that we are a grassroots group, we have increased the number of resident directors from each town from two to three. This has strengthened the town teams that are so crucial to our success in building the trail. They are our boots on the ground, and we now benefit from having more people contributing their ideas, energy and effort to the work of the Board of Directors as they also make things happen within their towns.

At the same time, the town teams have focused on increasing the number of active local participants. Each town team has added new members. They are working on outreach programs to schools and the community, encouraging the participation of young people through educational walks and community service projects, providing trail maintenance, holding town meetings, and generally mapping out the trail, maintaining it in good order, collaborating with local officials and ensuring that the residents of each town are aware of what we are doing and of its importance to their town.

Our strength lies additionally in our identity as one trail that links together our shoreline towns. The Shoreline Greenway Trail Board's all-town committees deliver this unified sense of purpose.

Building a greenway trail where no trail existed before along a desirable shoreline is a monumental task that will take the cooperation of the Shoreline Greenway Trail with local residents and landowners plus many town, state and federal agencies. As an allvolunteer organization, we will continue to dedicate thousands of hours to this task. If you are reading this Annual Report, we hope that means that you are with us!
